Context – highly educated; very affluent; schools along St. Croix River are one of the best schools in WI; referendum passed in 2020 which included remodeling elementary, middle, and high school – all schools are revitalized for our future growth; concerts may be coming back; more diverse; higher house values; higher household income; St. Croix River Crossing (bridge) built and bringing more people with a faster commute time to the Twin Cities; industrial increases; farming; small town feel; new library; updated grocery store; updated laundry mat.

Trends – feels like we are in transition due to pastoral changes, pandemic brought better technology, CLC wants to be settled; want stability; increase in growth with the number of homes; established a virtual platform; more welcoming/approachable; always been a simple worship and down to earth; the dinner church is another simple and down to earth approach to ministry; pastor who is outgoing, friendly, welcoming, more informal then formal, get to know the core of each person, connection before content; note cards (personal touch to encourage involvement); psychological safety (we all make mistakes, but together we will learn and support the pastor); we are bringing in less and less funds; CLC offering should be acknowledged and praise given at the altar and Simply Giving encouraged, but not over encouraged; COVID effects – increased spousal/child abuse; increased mental illness; food shelf needs; introvert/extrovert positives and negatives; family is important.

Programs – survival mode; never enough volunteers; Dinner Church (newer – posters around the village, should add to FB communications).

Current programs: Shoe Away Hunger (last 5 years); food shelf collection; mitten tree; shoebox collection; sense of community; fellowship; connections between generations; Christ's Kids education; confirmation; high school youth group; mission trips; adult/kid choirs; ukulele ministry; during school year – weekly meals; special events (fundraisers, Truck or Treat, Election Night Ham Dinner); holiday services; music classes; bible study; men and women's groups; crafting club; Pea Soup Days parade; drive-in service; weddings; baptisms; funerals; hall rental; church family support (meal trains, Augie's Angels); meeting space for Scouts, AA, etc.; Love Baskets – Christmas partnership with Salvation Army; Scandinavian meal.

Future programming ideas: community preschool or daycare; community homeschool social club; homework helpers (tutoring); Peas Soup Days booth; neighboring community celebrations; backpack program (weekly snacks/school supplies); Somerset Chamber of Commerce member; overnight winter homeless shelter; tween & teen fun activity club; high school volunteer club – painting river supports, helping elderly, etc.; confirmation class reunions; support groups; fall festival/solstice celebrations/music festival; elementary school dance; middle school dance; partnership with Kennedy's Café for Thanksgiving; partnership with Best Christmas Ever.

Goals – enthusiasm; people in seats; internet/tech friendly/sound; building utilization; LADC Discover Center – call committee wants to ensure there are Christian values and religion-based curriculum.

Energy – need a pastor with energy; the congregation's energy is trending up; many congregation members are waiting to see how we respond; energy in our youth; we are here to stay and are revitalizing.

Partnership – interest in partnering with Trinity/Zion; signage to share we are here and open; build a Bridge/St. Anne's/CLC partnership (a few activities were started pre-COVID and we want to revive this) – kids are at school together, so kids can bring their friends for an activity night; energy in youth; Bridging Somerset (school district); partnership with concert grounds (KTIS Joyful Noise, meals, care, etc.).

Ministry Site Characteristics – informal, not spontaneous (3); some defined goals (2); racially becoming more diverse as our community grows (3); we are welcoming and encourage ideas (2); we rely on our leaders for direction (1); avoid conflict – however, conflict is an opportunity to learn (3); facilities are used by community groups (1); currently not training, but have trained people to minister inside our walls (3); we focus on skills and action (4); obviously evangelical Lutheran in identity and practice (1); we have participated in retreats and activities with the synod and ELCA which COVID has limited (2); we focus on Biblical studies and doctrine (1).

Motion to adjourn made by Julie and seconded by Sharon. Meeting adjourned at 7:10pm. Sharon led a closing prayer. Next meeting's agenda, continue working on the MSP. Next meeting on Thursday, November 4 from 5:45pm-6:45pm.
