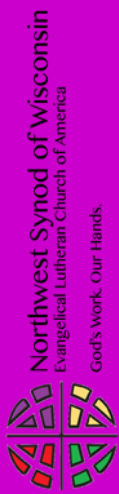

Dear Partners in Ministry,

### SPECIAL WORSHIP THE WEDNESDAYS OF LENT

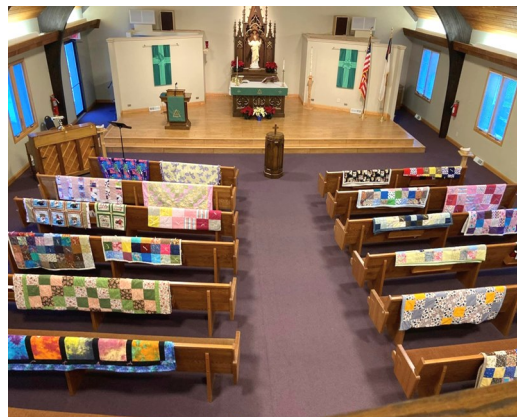

## Bishop Laurie Skow-Anderson

January 15, 2024

Dear Pastors, Deacons, SAMs and Lay Leaders of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin,

After much prayer, reflection and conversation with my family I have decided not to seek a second term as bishop. It has been an honor and privilege to serve this synod first for four years as the Director of Evangelical Mission and now for the last six years as Bishop. I am grateful for your partnership in ministry, your prayers, support and trust through these years. Serving through COVID was an unexpected challenge! Through it all I was proud of your creativity, hard work and determination to continue to proclaim the good news and care for your congregations and communities. I am confident that you will continue to serve faithfully walking in the way of Jesus in the future. Please know that I will pray for you and for the next bishop.

I invite you to take time in these next few weeks to pray about the bishop's election. Please plan to attend your conference assembly in February. This meeting will be the nominating ballot to begin the pre-identification process for the bishop's election. Your Deans will be sending information about the meeting. You are receiving this letter on Martin Luther King Day, January 15. Martin Luther King Jr., the Baptist pastor and civil rights leader was born on this date in 1929 and was assassinated on April 4, 1968. This federal holiday is declared to be a National Day of Service. We are encouraged to volunteer and do something to improve our communities. Martin Luther's dream was to address the racism, violence, hatred and poverty and create the Beloved Community. I hope and pray that you and your members will take your faith to the streets and be servant leaders in your communities for Jesus' sake. In these last six years we have tried to create space for intentional conversations about racial, environmental and gender justice. It is my dream you will continue to do so. Date: December 12, 2023

Meeting called to order: Time 5:37 pm

Devotion: Sharon Swanson read from Matthew 21:9.

Approve previous month's minutes: Motion made by Ashley and Seconded by Donnie. Motion Passed.

### Pastor's Report:

Christmas plans are finalized.

Feed My Starving Children on January 24th is scheduled and anyone 5+ is welcome to join.

Narthex is really dark, Pastor would like to find a way to get more light.

Donnie let him know that Buildings and Grounds is meeting and he can bring that to their department.

The signage for the church still isn't being used. Donnie discussed the permitting issue and the possibility of getting a neighbor to agree to let us put a sign in their yard.

Can we use Sign Up Genius or another application to put out a need in the church for people to see and sign-up to help where and when needed? This was discussed and will be looked into further.

Pastor asked "What if our council meetings were not about reports, what would they look like then?" Marty stated that he's been trying to move the council away from the reports. He thinks an agenda revamp would include shoutouts to what good work various ministries are doing. Donnie believes we should focus the council on sharing with the congregation what the church is doing and he believes we could put more focus on what the church is doing out in the community. Pastor wants council to be informed about what is going on, and believes the reports to council are important, but asked if we emailed them instead so council can focus on other things. Paul stated that the council meeting has turned into a mechanical meeting, with talk of making changes, but we haven't acted on those.

Pastor asked what the council should keep doing, stop doing and start doing? Ashley suggested we stop meeting monthly. Donnie stated that when his union went from monthly to quarterly, they lost a lot of participants. Marty suggested meeting monthly but add structure starting with purpose, mission and vision. Sharon A. encouraged that we continue to meet monthly as there are people who can't meet every month so it cuts others out. Donnie suggested that quarterly we encourage the congregation to join us, maybe offer a potluck dinner to encourage attendance.

## Financial Report:

General Fund deposits \$10,680 and withdrawals were \$7,520.

Designated Fund deposits \$2,498 and withdrawals were \$14,754.

### Building and Properties

Furnace thermostats have been installed throughout the church, Jeremie Rudek donated them.

The elevator is 21 years old, a part was found for replacement to fix it. They are changing service companies to save money.

Two toilets were donated and put in the men's bathroom.

The snowplow company has been replaced and will save us money this winter.

There were some water issues in the basement that will need to be addressed in the spring.

There is a group that meets on Fridays at Not Justa Cafe for breakfast.

Bible studies are still meeting.

## New Business:

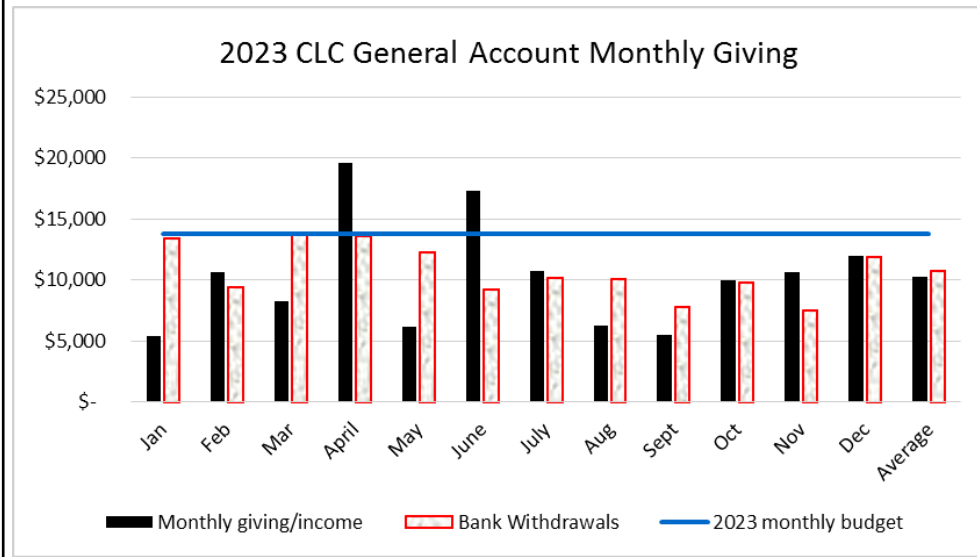
All ministry teams need to email their annual budgetary needs and their end of the year reports to Chris, Beth and Donnie. Ashley will send email.
