"Garden Reflections"

Dear Partners in Ministry,

One activity I mostly enjoy in the summer is tending to the perennial and vegetable gardens on my family's property. I say mostly because sometimes the weeding and mulching can take more time than I have to give. But I do think gardening can be a sort of devotional practice as well.

When we garden, we remember that the weeds and toil of it are a result of the original sin described in the book of Genesis. We also can think of those weeds as metaphors for the areas of our lives that need to be yanked out, roots and all, to make room for growth of "plants" that are more desirable and beneficial to us.

When we garden, we remember the parables of Jesus, including about the seed that feel on good soil, versus on rocky or poor soil.

When we garden, we can slow down from our otherwise busy lives, and literally stop to smell the roses and other fragrant smells God created for us.

When we garden, sometimes we try to bring a bit of order out of chaos, much like I believe God does in our own lives when we stop to be in God's presence and spend time in prayer with our Lord.

When we garden, as we harvest the fruits of our labor, such as strawberries or raspberries, we are reminded of the fruits of the Spirit which are love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

Finally, when we garden, we can remember that God created us from the dust beneath our feet, and since we shall return to that same ground, we ought to use a good portion of our time on this earth loving God and our neighbors out of thanks for this precious life that God gave us and the eternal life that Jesus makes possible for us. May God bless you this summer abundantly!


