Dear Partners in Ministry,

Happy New Year 2025! For those over 30, Y2K doesn't seem like it was 25 years ago! But here we are, a quarter of the way through this 21st century. Time keeps marching on. Some are born and some die each year- reminding us that this world is in a constant state of change. That's certainly true in the church too. Ministries that drew in families by the dozens years ago, no longer do. Pastors and staff come and go. Annual traditions come to an end. New ones begin.


